

## WRAY ENDOWED PRIMARY SCHOOL

### UNIFORM POLICY

It is the policy of Wray Endowed School to encourage the wearing of a school uniform in order to establish a standard of dress and easy recognition in out of school activities. The school colours are red, grey, white and black.

BOYS – Black/Grey trousers or shorts  
Red Sweatshirt  
Red/White polo shirt  
Black or grey socks (no patterned socks please)

GIRLS - Grey/Black skirts or trousers  
Red sweatshirt  
Black, grey or white socks or grey, black, red or white tights  
Red/White Polo shirt  
In summer, a red and white checked/striped dress

All children from Year 1 are required to have a red book bag available from Mike's Sports World.

#### **P.E. Kit**

Black shorts/skort and school red T shirt. It is necessary that children change for P.E. in the interest of hygiene. It is also essential that shoes worn for P.E. should not be worn outside at playtime. P.E. must be done in bare feet or in soft plimsolls as recommended by the P.E. Adviser.

#### **Games Kit**

Black jogging bottoms, Wray t-shirt (or a plain red or white t-shirt) trainers and a school sweatshirt or jumper (or a plain red sweatshirt)

Older children may also need football kit or its equivalent with suitable footwear for playing football.

We make certain recommendations to comply with Health & Safety regulations.

- Fashion shoes are not suitable for wear at school.
- Boots may be worn to school, but indoor shoes should be provided for children to change
- If your child's ears are pierced your co-operation is asked to make sure that your child wears only flat sleepers in school. Earrings are particularly dangerous for P.E. and games. No jewelry should be worn though your child may wear a watch. All items are to be removed for P.E.
- Earrings must be removed for swimming lessons. The swimming pool policy is that children shouldn't swim with ear-rings in.

**Outdoor wear**

A weatherproof coat should be worn to school each day during winter months and wet/cold weather as children are encouraged to play out in most weather conditions for a short while each day.

Children are encouraged to wear their own *or* school caps as protection in hot or sunny weather.
