This year at Wray, we aim to enhance our love of reading and, in doing so, will ensure that all children become confident readers who can say what they enjoy reading and why. Each class will be read to daily from their class reading book or a shared story, as well as having a whole school book read to them on a weekly basis in assembly. Children will also have the opportunity to listen to high quality audio books.	'Celebrity' readers will be invited into school/individual classes to read their favourite books to the children.	We will share our favourite books in our classes and across the school. We will also invite families in to share a 'Book and Biscuit' with their children. Throughout the year, we will also invite children to bring a book in from home that they no longer want and swap it for another book.	Children will have the opportunity to attend a Book Club at different times throughout the school year. They will publish their 'recommended reads' in the school newsletter.
We will send out surveys to find out what children and their families would like to know/have support with regarding reading. We will also let you know what our expectations of you are and support you however we can.	Every child will be gifted at least one book during every year they spend at Wray primary School. We will also ensure they have the opportunity to meet visiting authors, attend a book fair and visit a library.	Throughout the school year, children will have the opportunity to take part in reading challenges, book quizzes, theme days and a sponsored read.	We will continue to enhance our school library and class reading areas to make sure they are inviting and accessible for all children. Children will be invited to contribute to school reading display boards.
