

English

Our learning in English will include further exploration of different text types for reading and writing. These will include poems with figurative language, playscripts, persuasive writing and a historical narrative. Our English learning will be linked to our History and Geography topics as well as our class reader for this term, *Who Let the Gods Out?* By Maz Evans.



Big Writes will continue on a regular basis, giving the children opportunities to write different text types focusing on a variety of styles of writing, adapting for different audiences and developing vocabulary, grammar and spelling.

Spelling and grammar lessons take place weekly, along with guided reading sessions, giving the children opportunities to use and apply their new learning in their independent reading and writing.



Music

Mrs King will continue to teach music. This term the focus will be on singing, playing instruments, improvising, composing, performing (improvising with instruments focus)

The children will also be revisiting and revising topics from earlier in the year as well as preparing for our summer production.

Art/D.T

In art, the children will be exploring drawing and sculpture, linked to our theme for this term.

In D.T they will develop the link to our theme and topics with a focus of different structures.

The children will learn how to build on their prior learning to develop their skills and evaluate their work.

Geography

2nd half term: We will learn about mountains around the world, including in our locality, with a focus on Everest and the impact of tourism.

Where do we find guidance about how to live our lives?

This term the children will complete a project based on where Christians find guidance through books, worship, holy places and community. They will then compare this to the Jewish faith, identifying similarities and differences in the ways that people find guidance about how to live their lives. The children will think about how this relates to their own lives.

Forest School

Children will have Forest School in the second half-term of the Summer term. We will be focusing on using tools and making fires and fire safety. We will also do some cooking. We will also complete some challenges and problem solving linked to some of the challenges ancient civilisations may have faced.

Maths

This term we will continue to consolidate learning from the previous two terms. We will also be learning about area and perimeter; shape space and measure; position and direction and statistics.

We will also learn times tables, practise mental maths skills and develop perseverance and resilience in problem solving activities.

The children should use our homework platform Doodle Maths, to practice and consolidate their learning at home.

Science

We will begin by finishing our work on Evolution and Inheritance, before moving on to Properties and changes of materials - we will look at separating mixtures, dissolving, reversible and irreversible changes. We are looking forward to doing lots of investigations!

P.E.

At the start of the term the children will continue to practice maypoling. The first half term will also include athletics and striking/fielding games with a focus on cricket and rounders. The children will take part in a dance unit in the second half term as well as preparing for our annual sports day

History

1st half-term: The children will learn about Ancient Greece with a particular focus on the development of the Olympic Games.
